



## PLANTS, PLANT PRODUCTS AND OTHER OBJECTS WHICH REQUIRE A PLANT PASSPORT FOR MOVEMENT WITHIN THE EU

1. **All plants for planting:**
  - plants that have been planted and the intention is for them to remain planted;
  - whole plants or living parts of plants (cuttings etc.) that are not planted and the intention is for them to be planted;
  - plants that have been lifted and the intention is to replant them.
  
2. **Plants of the following** (living plants and parts of plants whether or not they are intended for planting) **other than their fruits or seeds:**
  - *Casimiroa* (Flowering plants that are part of the *Citrus* family);
  - *Choisya* (Mexican Orange);
  - *Citrus* (Fruit bearing and flowering plants belonging to the *Citrus* family);
  - *Clausena* (Flowering plants that are part of the *Citrus* family);
  - *Fortunella* (Kumquat);
  - *Murraya* (Flowering plants that are part of the *Citrus* family);
  - *Poncirus* and their hybrids (Trifoliolate Orange);
  - *Vepris* (Flowering plants that are part of the *Citrus* family);
  - *Vitis* (Grapes);
  - *Zanthoxylum* (Flowering plants that are part of the *Citrus* family).
  
3. **Fruits of *Citrus*** (orange, lemon, lime, grapefruit etc.), ***Fortunella*** (Kumquat), ***Poncirus* and their hybrids** (Trifoliolate Orange), **with leaves and peduncles still attached.**
  
4. **The following seeds:**
  - *Allium* (Onion, chives, shallots, leeks etc.);
  - *Brassica napus* (oilseed rape);;
  - *Brassica rapa* (Field mustard)
  - *Capsicum* (Peppers);
  - *Glycine max* (Soybean);
  - *Helianthus annuus* (Sunflower);
  - *Linum usitatissimum* (Flax/linseed);
  - *Medicago sativa* (Alfalfa);
  - *Oryza sativa* (Rice);
  - *Phaseolus coccineus* (Runner bean);
  - *Phaseolus vulgaris* (French beans);
  - *Pisum sativum* (Peas);
  - *Prunus armeniaca* (Armenian plum/Ansu apricot);
  - *Prunus avium* (Wild flowering cherry);
  - *Prunus cerasus* (Sour Cherry);
  - *Prunus domestica* (Common plum);
  - *Prunus dulcis* (Almond);

- *Prunus persica* (Peach);
- *Prunus salicina* (Chinese/Japanese plum);
- Seeds of *Solanum tuberosum* (True seeds of potato);
- *Sinapis alba* (White mustard);
- *Solanum lycopersicum* (Tomato);
- *Vicia faba* (Broad bean).

**5. Wood that is included in any of the following:**

- Wood that is considered a plant product;
- Wood that has been obtained in whole or part from *Juglans* (Walnut), *Platanus* (Plane) and *Pterocarya* (Wingnut), including wood which has not kept its natural round surface; and
- Any wood or wood products included in the table below:

CN code	Description
<b>4401 12 00</b>	Non-coniferous fuel wood, in logs, in billets, in twigs, in faggots or in similar forms.
<b>4401 22 00</b>	Non-coniferous wood, in chips or particles
<b>4401 40 90</b>	Wood waste and scrap (other than sawdust), not agglomerated.
<b>ex 4403 12 00</b>	Non-coniferous wood in the rough, treated with paint, stains, creosote or other preservatives, not stripped of bark or sapwood, or roughly squared.
<b>ex 4403 99 00</b>	Non-coniferous wood (other than tropical wood, oak ( <i>Quercus</i> spp.), beech ( <i>Fagus</i> spp.), birch ( <i>Betula</i> spp.), poplar and aspen ( <i>Populus</i> spp.) or eucalyptus ( <i>Eucalyptus</i> spp.)), in the rough, whether or not stripped of bark or sapwood, or roughly squared, other than treated with paint, stains, creosote or other preservatives.
<b>ex 4404 20 00</b>	Non-coniferous split poles; piles, pickets and stakes of non- coniferous wood, pointed but not sawn lengthwise.
<b>ex 4407 99</b>	Non-coniferous wood (other than tropical wood, oak ( <i>Quercus</i> spp.), beech ( <i>Fagus</i> spp.), maple ( <i>Acer</i> spp.), cherry ( <i>Prunus</i> spp.), ash ( <i>Fraxinus</i> spp.), birch ( <i>Betula</i> spp.) or poplar and aspen ( <i>Populus</i> spp.)), sawn or chipped lengthwise, sliced or peeled, whether or not planed, sanded or end-jointed, of a thickness exceeding 6 mm.

**6. Exceptions for movement of seed:**

There are specific exemptions from the plant passport requirement for RNQPs (regulated non-quarantine pests) for certain types of movement of seed. These include:

- The supply of seed to official testing and inspection bodies.
- The supply of seed for processing and packaging.
- The supply of seed for the production of certain agricultural raw materials, or seed propagation for that purpose.
- The movement of seed intended for scientific purposes, selection work and other test or trial purposes.
- The movement of seeds not yet finally certified.
- The movement of species for which the UK has a marketing derogation.
- Movement of seed intended for export outside of the EU.

**7. Transitional period for seed and other propagating material:**

Where the plant passport requirement is solely because of an RNQP (regulated non-quarantine pest), there is a transitional period where seed and other propagating material produced before 14 December 2019 can be moved without a plant passport until 14 December 2020.
