

Exporting ornamental plant propagating material in a 'no deal' exit from the EU

Do you export propagating material of ornamental plants to the EU?

YES

After the UK leaves the EU

It is the responsibility of the exporter to ensure the labelling and quality assurance requirements of the receiving member state are met

AND

the variety must have EU PVR, or be registered in any EU member state, or be 'commonly known' before September 2012.

NO

No action required

The EU will treat the UK as a third country.

Speak to Horticulture & Marketing Unit to find out if you will need a phytosanitary certificate or additional testing to export to the EU.

Find out more

- The UK will accept EU ornamentals for a two year interim period – after this period third country rules will apply.
- If the plant material previously needed an EU Plant Passport to be imported into the UK from the EU, a phytosanitary certificate will be required.
